

## Stacking a Pallet of Clay Roof Tiles

### First 5 Rows:

Clay roof tiles are stacked as doubles (ie. with 1 tile up and 1 tile down – inner centres facing each other) in a row of 4 across the front, 4 across the back and a single stack on either side of the centre. See diagram below. Repeat this for another 5 Rows.

### Next 5 Rows:

Reverse the tile order as per the diagram below, stacking as doubles for another 5 rows.

Top 2 Rows: Stack as doubles for 2 Rows repeating in the same order as the 'first 5 Rows'.

### Notes:

- Use only full complete roof tiles.
- All roof tiles must be packed tight and even to ensure the safety and stability of each pack for moving and stacking.
- The pallet must be placed on flat even ground. The pallet must be placed where the forks of a crane/forklift can access the bottom openings. If there is more than one pallet - there must a good walking space (approximately 70cm) around the edge of the pallet so that it may be wrapped when completed.
- Do not place pallets under power lines, trees, roof or building. A crane must be able to lift upwards to move the pallet. Place pallets next to road as the truck will not drive on driveways in case of damage to the driveway.
